Teen Camps**Junior Startup Camps** **NEW** (9 – 13 years)

Many great companies got their start in Sunnyvale. Be the next one! Now aspiring entrepreneurs can get a jump on the competition with Junior Startup Camp. Based on the Junior MBA (Media/Money and Business Awareness) curriculum, this three-camp series consists of Invention Camp, Marketing Camp and Business Camp. Sign up for all three, or the one that most interests your entrepreneur. Campers are grouped into “companies” with students of similar age and experience level. For an additional fee of \$35, payable to the instructor at the first class meeting, campers can have their project memorialized in a video and entered into the Young Visionaries contest.

Invention Camp 8/3 – 8/7, 9 a.m. – Noon

Research and development teams brainstorm ideas for new products, improve inventions and learn about feasibility, Internet Protocol (IP) and Digital Rights. Plus, teams work on a challenge project to create a simple solar powered gadget, a crazy Halloween costume from everyday material or an elaborate Rube Goldberg-type machine to perform a simple task. Inventions are showcased on the last day of class.

Marketing Camp 8/3 – 8/7, Noon – 3 p.m.

Marketing teams work together to promote inventions made by Invention camp R&D teams. Learn basic marketing and communication concepts, analyze media messages and ads through games, projects, skits and many other fun activities. Teams create a marketing campaign and website, conduct customer interviews, build a commercial and create a marketing presentation. Each team’s final presentation will be showcased the last day of class.

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Business Camp 8/10 – 8/14, 9 a.m. – Noon

Teams work together to get a student invention to market. Campers learn the basics of operations, manufacturing and finance, develop a business pitch and get funding. They also learn about different jobs within a company, write a resume and interview for teams. Finally, companies manufacture their product and compete in a tradeshow where they will take orders, sell products and pitch investors for more funding. Each team’s final business presentation will be showcased the last day of class.

Teen Pioneer Camps (11 – 18 years)

Middle school and high school teens venture into “real job” territory, developing practical skills and confidence that can help them land summer jobs as juniors and seniors, while still enjoying the fun of summer camp right now. Every week features a fun teen field trip and weekly recreational swim day, along with valuable training. Teens who participate in the Community Service Project weeks are eligible to receive service learning hours credit for their schools. Extended day options are available for families who need early drop-off or late pick-up.

Chill Week 6/22 – 6/26

Teen Pioneers kick off the summer by kicking around town, on field trips they help choose and plan. Teen choice field trips may include parks and local venues. Our highlight trip is Aqua Adventure Fremont Water Park.

Babysitting 6/29 – 7/02 (no camp 7/3)

Teen Pioneers become babysitters, with an opportunity to become an American Red Cross Certified Babysitter. Campers learn games to play with younger children, supervision skills and get coaching from Sunnyvale NOVA on how to market themselves to families who need sitters. Our highlight trip is Goffland.

Jr. Public Safety Officer Week 7/6 – 7/10

Teen Pioneers get an inside look at Sunnyvale’s Department of Public Safety. Collaborate with our Public Safety offices on projects that serve the whole community. Our highlight trip is the Baylands Ropes Course and a BBQ.

Jr. Referee Week 7/13 – 7/17

Teen Pioneers team up with officials from local sports leagues to train as youth referees. Campers gain practical experience in basketball, and get coaching from Sunnyvale NOVA on how to market themselves to sports organizations that need youth referees year round. Our highlight trip is the Great Mall and a movie. Campers must be 13 years old to participate.
