### DAY 1: THURSDAY, 10/18

Transfer to San Francisco Airport for your flight to Honolulu. Upon arrival, transfer to the Aston Waikiki Beach Hotel for a two-night stay. Balance of the day at leisure to relax and enjoy "paradise."

### DAY 2: FRIDAY, 10/19

Breakfast at your hotel followed by a tour of Pearl Harbor, including the USS Arizona and USS Missouri. Free time in Waikiki before returning to your hotel and an evening to remember at the famous Germaine's Luau.

### DAY 3: SATURDAY, 10/20

Check out of the hotel early so you can enjoy a full-day Circle Island guided tour. Highlights will include Pali and Diamond Head lookouts, exclusive Kahala Estates, Hanauma Bay, North Shore surfing beaches, Waimea Bay, and sugar cane and pineapple fields. Tour ends at your ship, the Pride of America, where you begin a seven-night cruise around the Hawaiian Islands.

### DAY 4: SUNDAY, 10/21

Arrive 8:00 am at Kahului, Maui for a two-day port call. With over three-quarters of its land uninhabited, Maui is like one giant natural park. Humpback whales, which seem to seek out the world's most beautiful places, make this lovely island their breeding ground, as do spinner dolphins and a multitude of other marine life. Travelers who can go anywhere in the world come back to Maui again and again, because their Maui moments are some of the most treasured of their lives. There are 42 miles of world famous beaches, ranging from the little jewel of Red Sand Beach to the Black Sand Beach at Wainapanapa State Park. As Maui's only deepwater port, Kahului is a bustling harbor that's not far from some of the island's most scenic spots. Kahului is also the gateway to the island's sacred 'Iao Valley, where people of the island came to pay homage to the "supreme creator" in a setting of waterfalls, lush foliage, still pools and soaring peaks. Maui is also home to the world's largest dormant volcano, Haleakala. At the summit is a vast crater measuring seven-

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and-a-half miles long by two-and-a-half miles wide. The views from the top at over 10,000 feet above sea level are magnificent. Optional tours available for purchase.

**DAY 5: MONDAY, 10/22**

Another day to explore Maui. Ship departs at 6:00 p.m. for Hilo.

**DAY 6: TUESDAY, 10/23**

Arrive 8:00 am at Hilo, Hawaii—the Big Island of the Hawaiian chain. Dominated by the twin peaks of Mauna Kea and Mauna Loa, both over 13,000 feet high, the Big Island of Hawaii is almost twice the size of all the other islands combined. Spectacular white and black sand beaches, dramatic cliffs, active volcanoes and even cactus-studded deserts carve the terrain. The capital of Hawaii, Hilo, is located on the lush Hamakua Coast, renowned for spectacular wild orchids. In fact, the entire city of Hilo is like one giant greenhouse with spectacular tropical flowers at every turn. When the rains are plentiful, waterfalls careen through lush valleys and Rainbow Falls is one of the Big Island's loveliest. To the north, Akaka Falls plunges 420 feet over a volcanic cliff, while the peak of Mauna Kea, a million-year-old volcano, presides over it all from its lofty height. Optional tours available for purchase. Ship departs at 6:00 pm for Kona.

**DAY 7: WEDNESDAY, 10/24**

Arrive 7:00 am at Kona, Hawaii. Kona, located on the western coast of the Big Island of Hawaii, is warm year-round, offering spectacular sunsets, numerous historical sites, abundant wildlife and marine treasures. Visit the ancient Hawaiian Place of Refuge, take a walk in a cloud forest or join a snorkeling excursion to one of the crystal-clear lagoons that are sheltered by coral reefs and where manta rays and tropical marine life abound. Ship departs at 6:00 pm for Nawiliwili Bay, Kauai.

**DAY 8: THURSDAY, 10/25**

Arrive 8:00 am at Nawiliwili Bay, Kauai, Gateway to the Na Pali Coast, for a two-day port call. The flame-red flowers of the wiliwili tree frame this quaint port. Less known is the charming lighthouse built in 1932, which graces Nini Point at the northern end of Nawiliwili Bay. Rich in legend and lush with tropical vegetation, the island of Kauai is mythical and mysterious, majestic and sublime and unmatched in physical beauty—from its verdant rainforests to its palm-fringed beaches. It's easy to see why Kauai is often called "America's Garden of Eden." Kauai has provided the extraordinarily lush landscapes seen in movies such as Jurassic Park and South Pacific. It is home to Waimea Canyon, a striking gorge of red volcanic rock overgrown with greenery and known as "The Grand Canyon of the Pacific." Abundant sea life along the shores include rare endangered sea turtles, playful dolphins, moray eels and yellow tangs swimming in protected coves. This is the island to take that 4-wheel drive mountain safari or to soar in a helicopter to view the breathtaking beauty of this island.
