

Highlights... Greenfield Village & Henry Ford Museum, Edsel and Eleanor Ford House, Holland Tulip Festival, Mackinac Island, The Grand Hotel, Chicago, Millennium Park

Day 1: Friday, May 6, 2016 Allen Park, Michigan - Tour Begins Get ready for a journey through the coastal regions and farmlands of the Midwest. The tranquil beauty of Mackinac Island and the Great Lakes region is accented by old-fashioned traditions and incredible scenery.

Day 2: Saturday, May 7, 2016 Allen Park - Dearborn - Allen Park Today, visit Greenfield Village and the Henry Ford Museum for an experience in living history! Take in the historic homes and see the workshops where famous American icons like the Wright Brothers, Thomas Edison, Henry Ford and Robert Frost were once inspired. **Tonight, enjoy a special welcome dinner at the Edsel and Eleanor Ford House.** After an elegant dinner is served, a docent will guide you through the estate. Marvel at the exquisite architecture, breathtaking lakefront grounds and a collection of fine art that tells the story of one of America's most prominent industrial families. *(B, D)*

Day 3: Sunday, May 8, 2016 Allen Park - Holland - Grand Rapids This morning, depart for Holland, Michigan. All year long, this quaint village evokes the essence of spring with its vibrant floral display. **Get a taste of Holland's annual Tulip Festival!** Stop at the Veldheer Tulip Gardens* to view extraordinary flowers in bloom. Later, visit the Windmill Island Gardens and discover a palette of colors that spreads across 36 acres of manicured gardens, dikes and canals. See the only authentic Dutch windmill operating in the United States. Later, arrive in Grand Rapids. *(B)*

Day 4: Monday, May 9, 2016 Grand Rapids - Mackinac Island Enjoy a scenic drive to Mackinaw City where you will board the ferry that will take you back in time to a simpler era. Lake Huron offers up lovely views during your ferry ride to Mackinac Island. Upon arrival, discover how the neighs and clip-clops of horses replace the roar of engines. This quiet island of yesteryear evokes a nostalgia that



truly inspires the senses. **Your home for the next two nights is the glorious Victorian-era resort, the Grand Hotel**.** Both your hotel and the island itself are National Historic Landmarks. The island is a natural gem with over eighty percent of its land preserved by Mackinac State Park, a wooded paradise accented with limestone formations and ringed by Lake Huron. The evening is yours to enjoy. Perhaps you'll take a leisurely stroll through the quaint village or relax on the Grand Hotel's famous porch. *(B, D)*

Day 5: Tuesday, May 10, 2016 Mackinac Island Climb aboard your horse-drawn carriage for an island tour which includes stops at the Surrey Hills Carriage Museum and Arch Rock. Following your tour, take some time to enjoy all of Mackinac Island's quiet pleasures. Enjoy stunning views while sitting on the front porch of the Grand Hotel or take a walk downtown to visit the shops and buy some fudge, a favorite item on the island. Choose from a menu of tasty delicacies when you dine at the elegant Salle à Manger. Chamber music and demitasse precede dancing

to the refined sounds of the Grand Hotel's orchestra. If you crave a secluded hideaway, retreat to the charming cupola. *(B, D)*

Day 6: Wednesday, May 11, 2016 Mackinac Island - Green Bay, Wisconsin Enjoy some leisure time this morning at the Grand Hotel before departing for Wisconsin. En route, experience this state's picturesque landscape dotted with farmlands, idyllic red barns, and dairy cows roaming the pastures. Wisconsin is famous for its cheese. Small, family-owned cheese producers make most of it, specializing in award-winning varieties. Stop at a favorite local cheese shop for an opportunity to learn about, sample and buy some of its finest products. Later, arrive in Green Bay, Wisconsin's oldest city. *(B)*

Day 7: Thursday, May 12, 2016 Green Bay - Chicago, Illinois This morning, travel to Chicago! **This dynamic city goes by many names including "Second City" and "The Windy**

Experience It! The Grand Hotel

Stay for two nights in one of North America's most impressive hotels - the legendary Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island. Built during America's Gilded Age, the Grand Hotel is an elegantly designed Victorian lodge made from Michigan white pine. The grand opening of the Grand Hotel took place on July 10, 1887 - with room rates starting at \$3.00 a night. Guests arrive and depart the hotel by horse-drawn carriage – a romantic and whimsical nod to a simpler era. As you approach the majestic manor, the first thing you'll notice is the hotel's seemingly endless front porch. At 600 feet in length, it is the longest porch in the world. Five U.S. Presidents - Bill Clinton, George H. W. Bush, Gerald Ford, John Kennedy and Harry Truman - have all stayed at the Grand Hotel. The 1979 motion picture, *Somewhere in Time*, in which Christopher Reeve's and Jane Seymour's characters found love across time, was filmed here. Every October, fans of the film gather at the hotel for a weekend. Esther Williams' 1949 film, *This Time for Keeps*, was also shot at the hotel. The heated 220 foot, serpentine shaped, 500,000 gallon swimming pool is named in her honor. Your stay at this historic landmark is sure to be the highlight of your trip!

Please Note:

To complete your tour, we include roundtrip airport-to-hotel transfers when purchasing Collette airfare with your tour. If you have arranged for your own air, we are pleased to provide you the option of *purchasing* these transfers. Please note that all transfers will leave at prescheduled times.

*On Tulip Festival days the order of sightseeing may vary.

**The Grand Hotel experience includes dressing up for dinner. After 6:30 p.m., ladies are attired in a dress, skirt and blouse or pantsuit and gentlemen are required to wear a coat and necktie. Evening wear is required in all areas of the hotel except the Cupola Bar, where casual dress is acceptable at any time.

tours, as well as walking slightly longer distances, up stairs or on uneven walking surfaces should be expected.
