Tuesday, October 1, 2013

As one of the world's premier science museums, the Exploratorium is a place like no other. More like an experimental laboratory than a traditional museum, the exhibits are designed to stimulate questions instead of providing every answer. This is an opportunity to immerse yourself in a vibrant landscape of colorful sights, sounds, and curiosities. It's a day to have fun and further your understanding of the world around you. Even if you've been there before, it's time to go again and discover some of the 150 new exhibits and revisit old favorites at their beautiful new location on Pier 15 in San Francisco. Afterwards, we'll stop for lunch at Delancey Street where you'll have your choice of:

A) Grilled Ahi Tuna, served with organic field greens with Balsamic Vinaigrette; **B) Apple Glazed Loin of Pork**, served with sweet and sour red cabbage; or **C) Linguini with Smoked Chicken and Shitake Mushrooms**, served with

OLD SAN FRANCISCO MINT AND LUNCH AT THE GARDEN AND COURT


Wednesday, October 9, 2013

With a fascinating and glorious history, the Old Mint or "Granite Lady," is a National Historic Landmark, and the last major example of classic revival architecture in the United States. On your docent-led tour, you'll learn how its foresighted architect enabled it to survive the 1906 earthquake and how it was instrumental in the rebuilding of San Francisco. You'll see the vaults where up to 1/3 of the country's gold reserves used to be stored. Afterwards, it's time to visit another architectural masterpiece, the opulent Palace Hotel. First, it's lunch at their Garden Court Restaurant where your choices will be: **A) Scaloppine of Turkey**, with potato puree, lemon caper sauce, and winter vegetables; **B) Sonoma Green Salad**, with toasted almonds, truffle tremor goat cheese, raspberries, brioche croutons, sky hawk oil and vinegar; or **C) Chicken Salad Croissant**, with mixed greens, and green goddess dressing. All meals also include Palace Hotel signature biscuits, chocolate cheesecake with coffee sauce for dessert, and your choice of soft drink, coffee, tea, or iced tea. After lunch, you'll get a docent-led tour of the elegant Palace Hotel and learn of its glorious past.

Day Trips

SF BAY CRUISE

Sunday, October 20, 2013

The tides and the weather will influence exactly where we'll be able to go once we leave the Berkeley Marina, but no matter what, it should be a fun day. We'll be taking out one of Dolphin Charters' smaller boats to insure a smoother ride. Your on-board narrator will be well versed on both the history, with a special emphasis on lighthouses, and the natural history of the bay, so no matter where you go or what you see, this day promises to be both fun and informative. After returning to port, it's off to lunch at Kincaid's at Jack London Square in Oakland. Your entrée choices will be:

A) Blackened Salmon Caesar Salad, with Romaine hearts, garlic-parmesan croutons, shaved parmesan cheese, and Caesar dressing; **B) French Dip**, thinly shaved prime rib, homemade au jus, atomic horseradish on baguette, served with French fries; **C) Grilled Chicken with Fresh Fettuccine**, tossed in a cream sauce with spinach, tomato, topped with parmesan cheese; or **D) Mediterranean Mussels in Cioppino**, tomato-wine broth, fresh basil, and toasted bread. All meals start with clam chowder, include your choice of coffee, tea, iced tea, or soda, and a choice of dessert. Weather conditions are often cool and can change rapidly, especially out on the water, so please bring a waterproof jacket, dress in layers, and wear soft-soled shoes.

You may have visited all sorts of car collections and shops, but there is nothing that compares to Canepa Design's massive facility in Scotts Valley. The front doors open onto a showroom full of exotics, classics, and historical race cars from all over the world – and they're all for sale! If you're not in the market for a nearly priceless road rocket, it's okay, you'll enjoy the next stop on the tour – the Motorsports Museum featuring an amazing collection of vintage race cars. If you're more interested in the process that creates these dream machines, the shop area will give you a glimpse of what it takes to do ground up restorations, race car maintenance, and detailing. They do it all – and nobody does it better! After our tour, it's off for lunch at the Crow's Nest where your entrée choices will be:

A) Seafood Special of the Day, with rice pilaf; **B) Black Angus Sirloin Steak**, corn fed and specially aged, marinated in sweet smoky barbecue sauce, charbroiled and thinly sliced;

C) Charbroiled Chicken Breast, marinated in soy, cilantro and garlic, topped with pickled ginger and sesame seeds; or **D) Butternut Squash Ravioli**, sautéed with brandy cream, spinach and tomato. All meals also include house salad with bay shrimp, vanilla bean ice cream, and your choice of non-alcoholic beverages. Threatened by her formidable former lover Crown, and the seductive enticements of the colorful troublemaker Sporting Life, Porgy and Bess' relationship evolves into a deep romance that triumphs as one of theater's most

HISTORIC HOUSES

Thursday, December 12, 2013

Your day begins with a visit to the McConaghy House in Hayward. Built in 1886, this 12-room farmhouse offers visitors a fun and informative look at what life was like for farming families during the Victorian era. You'll really get a sense of how different everyday life was 125 years ago. For a special treat, the house will be decked for the holidays. Each year the decorations have a special theme. We don't know yet what this year's theme will be, but we're pretty sure it will true to the period and spectacular. Then it's off to lunch at Paradiso in San Leandro where your entrée choices will be: **A) Pan Seared Tilapia**, Panko bread crumbs, mashed potatoes and vegetables; **B) Penne Pasta with Filet Mignon**, Crimini mushrooms, fresh herbs, and Marsala cream sauce; or **C) Chicken Piccata**, garlic butter penne pasta and vegetables. All meals will start with the soup of the day, include vanilla bean crème brulee, and your choice of non-alcoholic drinks. After lunch, it's off to Meyers House & Garden in Alameda. Built by county architect Henry Meyers in 1897, it's a wonderful example of the Colonial Revival style that was popular around the turn of the century. Furnished with antiques from the Alameda Museum, donations from the community, and some items from the family, this is one beautiful house. Spread out over three city lots, the house, out buildings, and carefully tended grounds transport you to another time. Neither house has elevators, so please wear comfortable shoes and be prepared for a lot of walking and flights of stairs at both.

The pre-trip meeting will be held Wed., Oct. 2, from 1pm – 3 pm in the Sequoia Rm. at the Senior Center.

HOLIDAY SHOWS IN BRANSON

Fri., November 15, 2013 – Tue., November 19, 2013

This trip includes a variety of entertainment venues, including: Daniel O'Donnell, the Twelve Irish Tenors; Showboat Branson Belle; Yakov Smirnoff; Todd Oliver and his talking dogs and friends; the New Shanghai Circus, the Hughes Brothers & Family; College of the Ozarks, the Stone Hill Winery and downtown Branson.

The price for this five-day trip is \$1,999(R) pp double occupancy and \$2,399(R) single occupancy. Deposit is \$200 pp, with balance due Thur., September 5, 2013. Trip includes seven meals (four breakfasts, one lunch and two dinners) and four nights at the Radisson Hotel in Branson.

COSTA RICA ECO ADVENTURE

Sat., Feb 1, 2014 – Mon., Feb 10, 2014

Highlights of this trip: Tortuguero National Park, which we'll arrive at via river boat while in search of wildlife, and then visit Tortuguero Village; Sarapiquí Rain Forest and pre-Columbian ruins at Alma Ata Archaeological Park;



Arenal Volcano; Tabacon Hot Springs; Monteverde Cloud Forest, with a guided walk through the reserve including Sky Walk—a chain of bridges suspended high above the Cloud Forest; Tamarindo Diria Beach Resort located on the Pacific Ocean in Guanacaste.

The price for this ten-day trip is \$3,295(R) pp double occupancy and \$3,793(R) single occupancy. Deposit is \$600 pp, with balance due Thur., Nov. 14, 2013. Trip includes 19 meals (nine full breakfasts, three

lunches and seven dinners). *There's a \$75 discount off final payment for honorably discharged military personnel.*

Wed., April 23, 2014 – Tue., April 29, 2014

On this trip we'll visit: the U.S. Capitol Building; the White House Visitor Center; the World War II, Korean and Vietnam Veterans War Memorials; Mount Vernon, George Washington's home; the Arlington National Cemetery; the Smithsonian Institution; Baltimore, the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis; the Washington National Cathedral; and Ford's Theatre. Plus, we'll have time on our own to explore the Smithsonian.

The price for this seven-day trip is \$2,729(R) pp double occupancy and \$3,329(R) single occupancy. Deposit is \$425 pp (includes insurance), with balance due Thur., Feb. 20, 2014. Trip includes eight meals (five breakfasts and three dinners). *There's a \$100 early booking discount off final payment if your deposit is made by October 22, 2013.*

Trip Policies & Procedures

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Day Trips: Arrive 30 minutes before departure time to check in and board the bus. All participants must depart/return with the group on the bus. If you do not arrive by the departure time, you MAY NOT join the group while the trip is in progress.
- Slide show previews of extended trips - see page 5. You can now register for all trips upon receipt of this newsletter.
- **Registration for extended trips can be completed at the front desk before the September 10, 2013, slide show.**
- The Sunnyvale Senior Center reserves the right to make necessary changes or modifications to a trip, including menu choices.

Day trips will list the cost of the trip for both Sunnyvale Residents (R) and Non-residents (NR).

For extended trips, non-residents will be charged an additional \$50 per trip.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

DAY TRIPS

- Those canceling any day trip will receive a refund, less a \$10 administrative fee, charged by the City of Sunnyvale if:
 - 1) cancellation is received prior to the day of the trip, **AND**
 - 2) your place is filled from the wait list (if one exists).

NOTE: NO refund if your space is not filled by another participant.

- No-shows will NOT receive a refund.
- Full refunds are made if the trip is canceled by the Senior Center.

EXTENDED TRIPS

- Some deposits are not refundable. Please read the individual trip payment and cancellation policies that apply to the trip you have selected.
- Please be sure to read all trip cancellation and refund policies so you are aware of the penalties involved should you need to cancel your trip.
- There will be no refunds for any unused portion of a tour, unless covered by trip cancellation insurance.
- A cancellation letter is required to cancel a trip.

YOUR HEALTH & SAFETY

IMPORTANT - Members must notify the Senior Center of any changes to their Membership Form. Non-member trip participants must fill out a Trip Emergency/Medical Information Form. This information will be released to medical personnel should an emergency arise.

- Travelers needing special assistance must notify the Senior Center at the time you register to determine what assistance may be reasonably accommodated.
- Trip participants **must be able to independently participate** on trips (take care of personal needs, follow instructions, etc.) or have a caregiver with them to provide personal assistance during a trip. Escorts and bus drivers **CANNOT** be held responsible for lifting or assisting individuals with walking, boarding or deboarding the bus, or personal needs.
- Check with your physician on the advisability of traveling. There may be elements of an extended trip that may not be suitable for certain health conditions, such as high altitude.
- Bring your Medi-Care, Medi-Cal, or other insurance cards with you on a trip.
- If you use a walker or wheelchair or have other special needs, include this information on your Membership Form; non-members should include this information on your Trip Emergency / Medical Information Form. We will make all reasonable accommodations for you.
- Any accident/incident should be reported to a trip escort.
- Trip participants are required to carry PHOTO IDENTIFICATION on all trips for safety and security purposes.

 = trip includes some stairs and/or multiple times on/off bus

 = trip includes hilly terrain



PARKING

Cars are to be parked in the back parking lot at the end opposite the Sunnyvale Historical Museum for day and extended trips. This enables those attending Senior Center classes, lunch program and senior clubs to use the parking spaces in front of the Senior Center, and those visiting the Sunnyvale Historical Museum to park near the museum. The bus will drop participants off at this same location when returning from trips.



REGISTRATION INFORMATION!

Register Now! You can walk in, call or mail in your registration forms for all trips as soon as you receive this newsletter.

Day trips: Use the reservation form in the newsletter for day trips only. You can sign up two people on each form, if they live at the same address.

Extended trips: Come to the Senior Center for the flyer and registration form, or go on our website Seniors.inSunnyvale.com, click on "Senior Trips" and print out the reservation form for the trip you want to go on.

Service fees will be charged for companions who are 21 - 49 years old. The additional fees are: \$5 for each day trip and \$25 for each extended trip.

PAYMENT INFORMATION

- Prices are based on a per person basis and payment is due at the time of registration.
- Trips may be paid by cash, check, or credit card (Mastercard or VISA).
- For extended trips a \$50 pp non-resident fee is due at time of final payment made out to the City of Sunnyvale.
- Make checks out to the **City of Sunnyvale** unless otherwise noted. A fee of \$30 is charged for any returned check.

REMINDERS

You don't have to be a member of the Sunnyvale Senior Center to go on a trip, although it's encouraged and recommended. However, you must be at least 50 years of age, unless you are accompanying a senior traveler.
