Visual & Performing Arts Workshops



Indicates a minimum age limit applies.

(All ages) Workshops are open to children ages 3-12

- 1) **Treasure Tote** – Customize your 2013 Hands on the Arts tote bag with Arts with all manner of bling, so everyone will know the treasures inside belong to you. *CHAC / First Five* (All ages)
- 2) **Japanese Brush Painting** – Use simple brush strokes to create elegant Japanese-style watercolor images of flowers, fish, insects, birds and trees. *Ami Wada* (Ages 6+)
- 3) **Watercolor Jellyfish** – Drip and splatter watercolors to create a beautiful, organic image of a jelly fish family. *Lori Nock* (Ages 5+)
- 4) **Bamana Mud Cloth** – Stencil with sticker shapes to create a striking black and white design, reminiscent of textile patterns made by the women of Mali. Each symbol has a meaning, and traditional mud cloths are used to tell stories. *My First Art Class* (All ages)
- 5) **Potato Pelicans, Carrot Condors** – Paint colorful birds using a variety of vegetables as the paint brushes. *Darlene Carman, The Painting Gourmet* (Ages 5+)
- 6) **Small World Dolls** – Make a pocket-sized doll from a recycled cork, costumed with Chinese joss paper, fancy yarn and other pretty findings. *Susan Worley* (Ages 5+)
- 7) **Origami** – Fold squares of paper into amazing 3-dimensional geometric shapes, animals, birds, flowers and more with traditional Japanese paper-folding techniques. *Christine Hirabayashi* (Ages 5+)
- 8) **Big Baggy Hats** – Fashion a special festival hat for yourself out of a brown paper bag, and festoon your creations with spangles, dangles and colorful doodads. *Dorsi Lynn Diaz* (All ages)
- 9) **Balloon Drums** – Stretch a bright balloon over a cardboard tube to make a simple drum with a beautiful sound. *Music For Families* (Ages 5+)
- 10) **Clay Postcards** – Imprint tropical leaves and seashells on a slab of clay to make a souvenir “postcard” of your day at Hands on the Arts. *Irish Jackman* (Ages 4+)
- 11) **Sand Bottle Painting** – Pour colored sand in a bottle in layers to “paint” a picture of mountains, trees, birds or a beautiful abstract image. *Laverl Matalavage* (All ages)
- 12) **Spiral Art** – Spin a groovy flower-like design with a spiral drawing tool similar to the popular 1970s drawing toy. It’s tricky, but fun, to draw a mathematical hypotrochoid curve by moving one drawing disk inside of another. *Katy Franz* (Ages 6+)
- 13) **Multicultural Masks** – Compare masks from Chinese, Indian and other cultures in the Euphrat Museum of Art’s collection. Then cut and fold paper to make features stand out in a mask of your own. *Lydia Sanchez* (Ages 5+)
- 14) **Button Picture Frames** – Cover a picture frame with buttons of all shapes, sizes and colors to make a special display spot for a favorite photo, drawing or poem. *JoAnn Barney* (All ages)
- 15) **Drawing with Mr. Green** – Learn the trick of sketching realistic or cartoon people, animals and things by building them out of simple shapes like circles, squares and triangles. *James Green* (Ages 6+)
- 16) **String Art Sculpture** – Add your own artistic touch to our ever-growing, ever-popular collaborative installation piece, a giant sculpture made of yarn and string, and decorated with mylar, bells and other fun found objects. *Ingrid Grassini* (All ages)
- 17) **Butterfly Pins** – Transform a scrap of felt into a cute butterfly pin to wear on your shirt or give as a gift. *Laurel Moglen* (All ages)
- 18) **Paper Diwali Lanterns** – Sharpen your scissoring skills and assemble a fancy paper kandil lantern, perfect for decorating for Diwali, the Indian festival of lights. *Tejas Patil* (Ages 5+)
- 19) **Middle Eastern Music** – Learn to sing a popular Arabic song and play Arabic rhythms on the tambourine. Participants are invited to return at the end of the day to perform onstage. *Elias Lammam* (All ages)
- 20) **Mayan Burial Masks** – Find out why Mayan kings and queens were buried in elaborate mosaic masks, while you decorate a paper replica of your own. *Rene Michel* (Ages 7+)
- 21) **Fun Visors** – Design a wearable paper sun visor that doubles as an animal mask. Choose one of our suggested critters, or create your own. *Shelly Walker* (All ages)
- 22) **Whirling Windsocks** – Fly a windsock you’ve “sewn” from a sheet of craft foam. In Japan, families celebrate Children’s Day by flying a fish for each child in the family on a pole outside their home. They also look great trailing behind a bicycle. *Carrie Whitney* (Ages 5+)



23) **3-D Prints** – Choose a multicultural image from around the world and make a unique 3-D paper relief of it on Japanese handmade paper. Color to make your print even more striking. A new workshop begins every 15 minutes. *David Russell Miller (Ages 7+)*

24) **Chenille Bugs** – Bend pipe-cleaners into butterflies, praying mantises and other adorable insects and take home a new pet on a paper leaf. *Kay Coen (All ages)*

25) **Wands, Wings and Things** – Recycle a variety of cool scrap materials into whimsical magic wands, fairy wings, swords, cloaks or armor. *East Bay Depot for Creative Reuse (All ages)*

26) **Hip Hop Dance** – Practice the latest hip hop moves, as you learn a simple, but high-energy routine to music by your favorite artists. A new workshop begins every 20 minutes. Participants are invited to return at the end of the day to perform onstage. *Linh Ton (Ages 7+)*



27) **Silly Snakes** – Help an old necktie shed its out-of-date image and become a fashionable, fun and flexible stuffed serpent that you can wrap around your arm, waist or drape over your shoulders. *Mark Whitney (Ages 7+)*



28) **Japanese Bonsai Trees** – Shape your own bonsai tree sculpture with pipe cleaner branches and tissue leaves. Japanese bonsai artists can spend years growing and shaping their miniature trees, but yours will take less than half an hour. *Charu Gureja (Ages 6+)*



29) **Bobbin Lace Suns** – Weave threads around a pin pattern using bobbin lace technique to make a sunshine ornament. *The Lace Museum (Ages 8+)*



30) **Balloon Twisting** – Twist balloons into a crazy hat, a sword, a flower or a bumble bee, with this POPular party art. A new workshop begins every 30 minutes. *Yammell Garcia (Ages 6+)*



31) **Mexican Folkloric Fun** – Dress up in traditional costumes and learn lively folk dances from different regions of Mexico. Participants are invited to return at the end of the day to perform onstage. *Elena Robles (Ages 4+)*


