The Sunnyvale Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Commission has a mission to promote safe bicycling, hence the topic of the utility bill stuffer that they sponsored.

With respect to your observation of cyclists running stop signs, this has been reported to the Department of Public Safety for enforcement. Subject Defective Pedestrian Walk Light at El Camino Real & Cezanne **Close Date** 09-19-13 4:16 pm

Message 9/19/13 This is my third complaint about the defective pedestrian walk light for walking from the SE to SW corners of El Camino Real and Cezanne. The first complaint was submitted online 3 to 6 months ago. The second complaint was submitted in writing to Sunnyvale personnel on the back of a Public Works Traffic engineer business card on 9/12/13 or 9/13/13. Today, I pushed the walk light button at the SE corner of El Camino Real and Cezanne during the last half of a full light cycle so I could walk to the SW corner of El Camino Real and Cezanne. The walk light never appeared. A new light cycle started and I did not push the button a second time because the walk button had already been pushed without the walk light ever appearing. Neither the walk light nor the tweeting walk sound ever appeared during the new full light cycle. I then viewed the start of a second new light cycle and I pushed the walk button at the time. Neither the walk light nor the tweeting walk sound appeared at the appropriate time. During the extended period of time of traffic traveling east and west on El Camino Real across Cezanne, I pushed the walk light button, which lighted the walk light. The defective walk light described above is a significant waste of time for a pedestrian abiding by walk light law, as I do, and constitutes a hazardous condition. Also, I feel like I am wasting my time submitting these complaints.

There is a blind spot (bush on left) for drivers at the stop sign for traffic coming from Matilda. It should be a four-way stop. Since Washington is a major street in that neighborhood with steady traffic flow, it would be great to have light up cross walks making it safer for pedestrians and bicyclist. Especially being that the park is nearby. On several occasions cars do not see pedestrians and then have to make immediate stops. Also, since the close of Charles street heavy traffic is now passing through Florence Street at high speeds. Making it unsafe for the children in our neighborhood. I would like to request speed bumps on Florence Street to slow things down. Lastly, when are you going to do something about the cal - trains parking on Florence and surrounding streets. It is RIDICULOUS! There is no parking for residents. I should not have to walk down the street with my baby in hand just to park near my home, so some cheap cal trains rider can save \$5-10! I know that there used to be signs that were posted and you removed them at the request of residents. That was because we were being ticketed for parking in front of own home. Then you made us pay a permit fee to cover the cost of printing- well I complained because that should have been free of charge to residents. I mean come on; the taxes that we pay can't cover a permit! Really, you have office pens that cost more than the printing costs! I think you should post the signs and send the residents a free permit.
