NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PROPOSED RATE INCREASES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017/18 WATER, WASTEWATER, SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING SERVICES

The Sunnyvale City Council will hold a public hearing regarding proposed increases to utility rates for City provided water, wastewater, solid waste and recycling services on **Tuesday, June 20, 2017, at 7 p.m. in the City Council Chambers located at 456 W. Olive Avenue in Sunnyvale.**

PROPOSED RATE INCREASES

Utility costs will vary based on actual use or subscription level, however, with the proposed rates, a typical monthly single family residential water, wastewater (sewer), and solid waste (garbage) utility bill will increase by 8.7 percent (equal to \$12.37 per month or \$148.44 per year). Individual utility rates may vary. However, the proposed rate increases for a typical single-family customer are:

Water (assumes use of 10 ccf/month and 5/8" service charge) –	\$6.71
Wastewater (standard monthly charge) –	\$4.29
Solid Waste and Recycling (65-gallon garbage cart) –	<u>\$1.37</u>

GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING RATE INCREASES

Sunnyvale's rates for utility services are based entirely on the City's costs for operating and maintaining its utility systems and services. No tax revenues are used to cover the cost of services. Each year, as part of the City's budgeting process, the City Council considers adjustments to utility rates. This review also includes projections of future rate adjustments needed over the next 20 years to ensure the sound financial condition of the City's utilities. This year, the overall change in water, wastewater, and solid waste and recycling costs are lower than projected in last year's budget.

Water Rate Increases

Water rates pay for the safe and reliable delivery of water to all Sunnyvale residences and businesses. All water customers are billed a flat service charge based on the size of the water meter; all water consumed is billed per unit of water (\$/ccf¹), according to the rate table. The proposed increase for the upcoming fiscal year is 12.5 percent for water service. The majority of the cost (approximately 60 percent) to operate the water utility is to purchase water. The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (Hetch Hetchy) has not announced an increase in the rate for purchased water. The Santa Clara Valley Water District has announced a rate increase up to 9.9 percent. However, neither supplier has agreed to decrease the contracted minimum quantity of water in their "take or pay" contracts, and due to water conservation efforts, water sales have remained lower than projected, resulting in lower revenue to cover operating costs.

In addition to the increasing cost of water, the City's water system is aging, with some portions of the system exceeding 50 years in age. Over the next twenty years, it is projected that more than \$110 million will be needed to replace water pipe, well and tank infrastructure.

The proposed water rate increase is projected to collect enough revenue to maintain the water fund in a sustainable financial position. However, even with the recent wet winter, there is increased volatility in the rates charged by the City's

wholesale water suppliers. Therefore, a pass-through provision is proposed in order to recover any mid-year increase in wholesale water rates.

The formula to be used to calculate the pass-through adjustments, if needed, is as follows: Total expected cost increase for wholesale water purchases through the fiscal year end divided by the total budgeted expenditures for the purchase of wholesale water for the remainder of the fiscal year. The percentage increase determined by this calculation will be applied to utility bills for each unit of water used for the balance of the fiscal year (ending June 30, 2018).

Wastewater Rate Increases

Wastewater rates pay for the collection and treatment of wastewater from all residences and businesses in Sunnyvale. The proposed increase for the upcoming fiscal year is 10 percent for wastewater service. The proposed increase reflects needed improvements to the City's aging wastewater collection and treatment infrastructure, and increases in operating and regulatory compliance costs. Specifically, the City has begun a significant effort to rehabilitate its aging wastewater treatment plant. This project, which is anticipated to cost approximately \$700 million, will be phased in over fifteen to twenty years.

Solid Waste and Recycling Rates

Solid waste and recycling rates pay for weekly removal, processing, transfer and disposal of solid waste and recyclables from all Sunnyvale residences and businesses and household hazardous waste services. Rate changes are being driven primarily by inflationary increases in costs for contracted collection, garbage transfer and disposal services. Additionally, rates include costs to implement the City's Zero Waste Strategic Plan and respond to state mandates to increase diversion of food waste and other materials from landfill disposal. The proposed rate increase for solid waste and recycling services is three percent.

This fall, the City will introduce FoodCycle – a new service to collect food scraps separately from garbage. As part of the new service, the City will replace residential garbage carts with new split carts which have a large compartment for garbage and a smaller one for food scraps. Food scraps make up approximately 30 percent of the garbage collected from Sunnyvale homes and contribute to greenhouse gas emissions when they decompose in a landfill. Based on the City's successful 2015 food scraps pilot program, participation in FoodCycle will help Sunnyvale reach its Zero Waste goal of keeping 75 percent of our waste out of the landfill by 2020.

Additional details regarding factors influencing rate changes will be available in the 2017/18 Utility Rate Report to Council. This report will be available in the City Clerk's Office and on the City's website at Sunnyvale.ca.gov.

PROTEST PROCESS

If you wish to protest the proposed service rate increases, the City must receive your *written and signed* protest prior to the close of the public hearing on June 20, 2017. As required by California Proposition 218, should the City Council receive written protests from a majority of customers, the proposed rates will not become effective and the current rates will remain in place.
