

Study Issue
Establishment of Guided Bicycle Routes Through Neighborhoods

Action Item B4.b of the 2006 City Bicycle Plan calls for consideration of bicycle guide signage on routes through neighborhoods, incorporation of destination names and directional arrows, and distances where appropriate.

The approved study issue is to identify neighborhood streets that are lightly traveled by vehicular traffic in order to establish a network of guided routes that assist bicyclists in finding ways through the City. BPAC members previously noted the need for referencing locations of transit stations and the Borregas Bicycle and Pedestrian bridges overcrossing US 1010 and SR 237.

Staff is in the process of preparing a set of criteria for selecting the neighborhood streets. The criteria list will be shared with the BPAC members during the March 18th meeting for discussion. In the meantime, the BPAC members are requested to identify their ideas for neighborhood routes that achieve a network, and share their thoughts with staff during the meeting. Attached is a copy of the Bicycle map for reference.
