

Safe Routes to School – The City of Sunnyvale is participating in the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program, which is a federal grant program that facilitates the planning, design, and implementation of improvement projects in and around neighborhood schools. The improvement projects are intended to enable and encourage students in kindergarten through eighth grade (K-8), including students with disabilities, to safely walk and bicycle to school. The City received SRTS design authorization from Caltrans to design the improvements identified in the City's Pedestrian and Safety Opportunities Study, as well as the Neighborhood Guided Bike Routes Study. The Department of Public Works will be implementing the following improvements:

- A guided bicycle route that generally follows Borregas Avenue, Morse Avenue and N. Sunnyvale Avenue.
- Intersection Improvements, including signage, striping and markings, will be installed to enhance safety at approximately 10 intersections.
- Crosswalk In-Road Warning Lights (IRWL) will be installed to increase pedestrian/bicycle visibility at the following locations:
 - Lakehaven Drive at Silverlake Drive
 - Old San Francisco Road at Central Avenue
 - Cezanne Drive, Between El Camino Real and Old San Francisco Road
 - Dunford Way at Quail Avenue
- Speed feedback signs to make drivers more aware of the speeds they are driving and help reduce speeds will be installed on the following streets:
 - West Remington Drive
 - Ponderosa Avenue
 - Washington Avenue (eastbound)
 - Washington Avenue (westbound)
 - Duane Avenue

The project design is nearing 100 percent design completion and construction is scheduled to start in the summer of 2015.
