SUNNYVALE CREATES ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT

John Stufflebean is the Director of the Environmental Services Department. “Our job is all about offering protection to the environment,” said Stufflebean. “It’s a role that has become increasingly important in today’s world and the City has not only recognized its responsibility, but has endorsed and embraced wide-ranging efforts to improve the environment.”
