SUNNYVALE PUBLIC HEARING ON DIRECTLY-ELECTED MAYOR

SUNNYVALE, Calif. – The City of Sunnyvale’s Charter Review Committee has scheduled a public hearing to consider the question of making the Mayor a directly-elected position. Currently, the Mayor is selected by City Councilmembers.

The public hearing will be at 6:30 p.m., Thursday, March 24, in the City Hall West Conference Room. The Charter Review Committee will invite public comment on the possibility of shifting to a directly-elected Mayor. The committee is also considering whether current Council compensation provisions should be kept or changed. The committee is specifically not considering changing the role or authority of the Mayor. The West Conference Room is located in City Hall at 456 W. Olive Ave.

The questions being discussed can only be changed by a majority vote of the public at the polls. The Charter Review Committee will make their recommendations, including input from the community, to City Council, which will ultimately decide if the issues should be put to a vote.
