HISTORIC MURPHY AVENUE SET FOR GRAND REOPENING

SUNNYVALE, Calif. – After months of redevelopment, Sunnyvale’s Historic Murphy Avenue is set for a grand reopening. A ribbon-cutting ceremony will be held at the corner of Murphy and Washington Avenues, Friday June 4, and will include remarks from Mayor Melinda Hamilton, Sunnyvale Public Works Director Marvin Rose, and a representative from VTA.

The project to redevelop Murphy Avenue, which began in July, 2009, made numerous improvements to the street, which is home to many restaurants and businesses. Sidewalks and curbs were rebuilt, new street furnishings, trees and street lights were added, and decorative gateway arches were installed. Additionally, the street’s underground utilities were upgraded.

The street will reopen to vehicle traffic at the conclusion of the ceremony. Members of the public are invited to attend the grand reopening ceremony, which begins at 10:30 a.m.
