About this Report

As part of its participation in The National Citizen Survey™, the City of Sunnyvale conducted a mailed survey of 1,500 residents. Surveys were mailed to randomly selected households in June 2017 and data were collected through July 2017. Toward the end of the official data collection period (see the report, *The National Citizen Survey: Community Livability Report, Sunnyvale, CA, 2017*), the City made available a web-based survey to its residents through a link on the City's website. Visitors to the site were able to complete the survey during the first half of July 2017 and 1,146 surveys were received.

This report contains the results of this administration of the web-based survey and have not been weighted to current population estimates of Sunnyvale.
