Artist Compensation

Artists who are selected to participate in the event will receive a stipend of \$350 following the event and a voucher for lunch the day of the event. Artist supplies will be provided based on the submitted supply request. Travel expenses and lodging will not be reimbursed. Full time/Permanent City of Sunnyvale employees are not eligible to apply.

Artist Responsibilities

Five artists will be selected to execute a mural during the event (Saturday, Sept. 14, 2019, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.). Artists will be expected to work all day, with a 30-minute lunch break. Artists are encouraged to speak with event attendees about their work, but should not allow attendees to work on their murals, especially children. (Working directly with children will require the artist to complete a background check.) Artists will be expected to finish their design by the end of the festival (3 p.m.).

Artist Sketch

Selected artists are required to submit a sketch of their planned design. No offensive images or statements will be allowed. Artists are expected to work with one of two themes: 1. Light, Love, Unity; celebrating the City's commitment to diversity and inclusion. 2. From the Valley of Heart's Delights to Silicon Valley: A history of Sunnyvale and Santa Clara county, highlighting early settlers, the transition from agriculture and industrialization and the rise of Silicon Valley. Designs should be original and artists will retain the copyright for their design.

Finished Mural

Final murals will be the property of the City of Sunnyvale. Murals are meant to be temporary art, but will be exhibited if space is available.

Event Set Up and Equipment

Artists will be provided with a table, 2 chairs and a shade tent. Signs noting the artist's name will be placed on site. No electricity or running water will be available, however, buckets for water will be distributed.

Artist's will be executing their design on two 4-feet by 8-feet prepared plywood boards. Each artist may choose to work on the ground or on tabletops.

Promotional Materials

Any promotional materials you would like to display or distribute at the event must be pre-approved by event coordinators prior to the festival day. Please attach a copy of any brochure or flyer you would like to distribute at your booth.

Please note, Artists are not permitted to solicit business, sell goods or services or advertise programs that could be construed as being in direct competition with City of Sunnyvale programs.
