



Construction and Demolition Waste Tracking Requirements for Projects in Sunnyvale

To satisfy CalGreen standards and LEED certification requirements, demolition, construction and recycling waste weights and/or volumes are to be reported to the City using Sunnyvale.WasteTracking.com hosted by Green Halo. Projects must meet a minimum rate of 65 percent recycling and/or reuse of nonhazardous construction and demolition waste.

When: Effective Jan.1, 2019

Who: All new demolition and alteration projects where 50 percent or more of the exterior wall is taken out.

Step 1: Before You Begin: Determine how you will manage debris, excess building materials, and salvage materials. Solid waste must be collected and disposed of in containers provided by the City's franchised hauler, Specialty Solid Waste & Recycling, with exemptions for certain activities.

- If you will be using a debris box from Specialty Solid Waste & Recycling, notify them that you are tracking your waste through Green Halo when you set up service. They will arrange for you to receive the appropriate weight ticket information.

Step 2: Prior to Issuance of Permit: Visit Sunnyvale.WasteTracking.com to create a project in Green Halo, provide waste estimates, and submit the project for initial review. You must provide evidence of plan approval to the One Stop Permit Center when applying for your permit.

Step 3: Throughout Your Project: Upload all weight tickets and receipts into the waste tracking system. Weight tickets **must** state the city of origin as Sunnyvale and the material type on the tickets **must** match what you entered into the system.

Step 4: Prior to Final Building Inspection: Finish uploading all weight tickets and submit the project for final review. You must provide evidence of final approval when requesting your final inspection.
